Awaiting Board Appointment

The Board is currently awaiting the Governor's appointment to represent the Mining & Mineral Extraction Sector for the state. Mr. W. Lester "Les" Aultman, whose term was completed in June 1999, was appointed in 1997 to a 2 year term, serving on the first RPG Board for Mississippi. The Governor will appoint the next Mining & Mineral Extraction representative to a 4 year term, expiring in 2003. Names under consideration for the post are Les Aultman, Ron Jenkins, and Ed Hollingsworth. These three individuals were duly nominated and elected by the registrants of the state for consideration by the Governor for the post.

Ericksen leaves Board

In other Board matters, Rick L. Ericksen resigned from the Board in June, having advised the Board of his departure in May. Ericksen was appointed to the first Board in 1997 as Representative for the Government Sector, for a term to expire in 2001. During his tenure, he ably served as the Board's President. Reasons for his separation were given as "personal considerations". Rick leaves with distinction and will be sorely missed.

Applications Status

The Board continues processing the deluge of application packages which were received prior to the *grandfathering* deadline in December, 1998. The application review procedure is thorough and time consuming; however, only a few (about 70) applications remain to be processed. Missing reference letters are a common problem for many applicants whose files are currently incomplete.

Joint Meeting with Alabama Board

On June 10th, 1999, the Mississippi RPG Board attended a joint meeting with the Alabama Board of Geology in Tuscaloosa. Their meeting lasted 6 hours, covering issues which included ethics, reciprocity, and joint enforcement, of respective geologic registration laws.

Reciprocity Initiated with GA Board

The Mississippi RPG Board has signed a letter of understanding for reciprocity with the Georgia Board of Geologic Licensure. This is a culmination of several months work by both boards. Contact the Board for details.

Status of the MOU

(Memorandum of Understanding) -

In June, the RPG Board sent a letter to the PE/PLS Board in an attempt to re-start the process of developing an MOU between both boards. The PE/PLS Board responded by requesting a joint meeting to discuss the "generic" MOU instrument drafted by the RPG Board. The meeting was held in late June and it is anticipated that a mutually acceptable document will be forthcoming shortly.
