Annual Report

Mississippi Code Annotated Section 73-63-19 provides that the Mississippi State Board of Registered Professional Geologists (MSBRPG) shall submit an annual report to the Governor in January, to include a complete statement of the receipts and expenditures of the Board. The details of expenditures and revenues are provided in the Board's FY 23 budget request, the most relevant portions of which are included in this report.

Executive Summary

- The Mississippi Board of Registered Professional Geologists was created to safeguard life, health, property, and to promote public welfare.
- The overall mission of this agency is to ensure that those publicly practicing geology, environmental geology, engineering geology, geophysics, geochemistry and other subdisciplines of geology, are adequately educated, trained, and experienced so that the public's health, safety and welfare are indeed being protected.
- The Board's mission includes the licensure and regulation of the public practice of geology by those who make geologic determinations and evaluations which may affect the public welfare. The practice of geology and its scope is defined in the Mississippi Registered Professional Geologists Practice Act of 1997 (§73-63-1 et seq, Mississippi Code, Amended 1972).
- MSBRPG also works with licensure boards and agencies in other states and with the National Association of State Boards of Geology to facilitate registration across the country and to play an active role in the preparation and relevance of the examinations required for professional registration and enrollment.
- The Board does not receive General Fund appropriations, instead the Board supports itself financially by collecting licensing and renewal fees from applicants for registration and enrollment.
- FY 21 Highlights:
 - The Board continued outreach and communication efforts by meeting with students and attending professional meetings.
 - o 32 registrants and enrollees were added to the roster.
 - Board operations continued effectively by fulfilling 95% of all requests within three business days.
 - o The Board began the process of reviewing its Rules and Regulations.
 - o The Board welcomed one new Board member and a new Executive Director.
 - Board operations continued uninterrupted during the COVID-19 pandemic.

BOARD OF REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL GEOLOGISTS

MSBRPG is composed of five members appointed by the Governor. Each member holds office for four years or is held over until the appointment of his or her successor. A member of the MSBRPG must be a Registered Professional Geologist in Mississippi, a resident of the state of Mississippi, and at least thirty years of age.

The Board maintains and operates by a Code of Professional Conduct and Ethics contained in its Rules and Regulations. The Board continually promotes a positive working relationship with private sector companies, universities, other State agencies, and geological licensure boards in other states to develop and share information to better serve the public.

 - Ensure through regulation and enforcement that Registered Professional Geologists protect the public's health, safety and welfare.

TEMPORARY WORK PERMITS

Applicants who are duly licensed or registered in a state with a law similar to Mississippi and is a true practice regulation act and are not residents of the State of Mississippi may apply for a Temporary Work Permit that allows them to practice geology on a temporary basis in the State. During FY 21, five (5) individuals who were licensed geologists and in good standing in other jurisdictions were issued time-limited Temporary Work Permits.

LICENSE AND ENROLLMENT RENEWALS

At the beginning of FY 21 there were thirty-five (35) enrolled Geologists in Training (GIT) and five hundred-thirty four (534) Registered Professional Geologists (RPG) in Mississippi. All enrolled GIT and RPG are required to renew their licenses annually, prior to January 1 of each year. At the end of FY 21, there were thirty (30) GIT and five hundred-forty (540) RPG in Mississippi. Thirty-seven (37) individuals did not renew their enrollment or registration.

MEETINGS

Per Mississippi Statute, the MSBRPG is required to meet at least twice (2) annually. Instead, the Board met four (4) times during FY 21. Per Mississippi Statute, all meetings were held in accordance with the Mississippi Open Meeting Act and were open to the public. Reasonable notices of all meetings were made available to the public prior to all meetings.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF STATE BOARDS OF GEOLOGY

The Board maintains membership with the National Association of State Boards of Geology (ASBOG®). In addition to the ASBOG® qualifying examinations, this Board's affiliation with ASBOG® provides an essential mechanism by which Mississippi, the Board and its membership, and the geologic educational leaders of this state are kept aware of national trends in the professional practice of geology and related areas. During FY 21, Board member Berry and Executive Director Musselman represented Mississippi by attending (virtually) the annual ASBOG® meeting.

GEOLOGY COMPETENCY EXAMINATIONS

The Board has the responsibility of administering examinations prepared by the National Association of State Boards of Geology (ASBOG®). Examinations were first offered in Mississippi in March, 1999 and are currently offered in thirty-four (34) states nationwide. The qualifying examinations, the "Fundamentals of Geology" (FG) and "Practice of Geology" (PG) are offered twice yearly. During FY 21 fifty-four (54) individuals sat for the FG exam and ten (10) individuals sat for the PG exam in Mississippi.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

During FY 21 the Board continued to review and revise its Rules and Regulations in anticipation of possible changes to the Rules and Regulations being submitted to the Occupational Licensing Review Commission at a later date.

CHANGES IN BOARD ADMINISTRATION

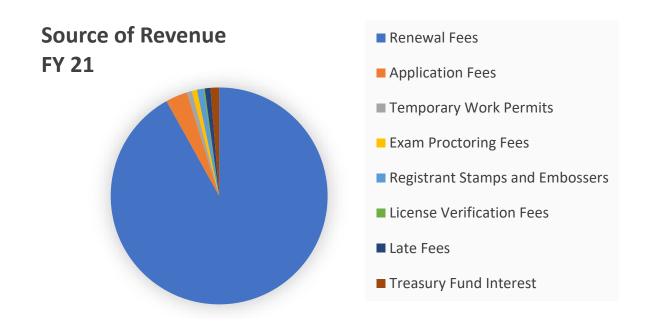

Approximately 92% of MSBRPG's revenue is from renewal fees.



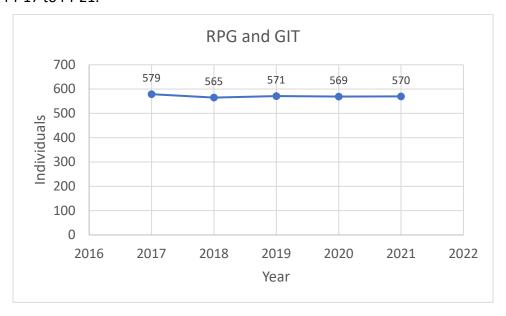
LICENSURE AND ENROLLMENT BY LOCATION

OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

MAGIC Fund Number 3385800000 is the Registered Professional Geologists Fund within the State's Treasury. The agency's main source of funding is through registration renewals. The agency currently charges \$200.00 per registrant per year with renewals due at the beginning of each calendar year. At the end of FY 2021 the agency had a total of 570 registrants and enrollees which generated \$107,700 in revenue. The agency also receives monies from those applying for RPG registration via an application fee of \$200.00 and from those applying for GIT enrollment via an application fee of \$100.00 These two fees generated a revenue of \$3,800. Other remuneration to the agency includes Temporary Work Permits (TWP) that on initial issuance are \$75.00 for ninety (90) calendar days and that increases by \$75.00 each time the TWP is renewed. The Board generally issues 5-15 TWPs each year. During FY 2021, 6 work permits were issued. The agency charges a \$25-\$35 proctoring fee for exams that it administers twice a year. During FY 2021 the Board collected fees for a total of 29 exams which generated \$905.00. The Board administered/proctored a total 36 test takers during the October 2020 ASBOG exam offering and 29 during the March 2021 offering. The March 2020 ASBOG exams were cancelled and deferred to October 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Summing the previously noted revenues and secondary minimal fees, and not considering any fines that may be levied during the FY, yields a total of approximately \$116,899 in revenue for FY 2021.

TREASURY FUND / BANK

The Trustmark National Bank checking account, which is listed as the "Mississippi State Board of Registered Professional Geologists," is used as a clearing account for the agency. It maintains an average daily account balance of \$1,000.00 and is used to transfer monies the Board receives through its program of Licensure & Regulation into its State Treasury Fund (MAGIC Fund Number 3385800000).

I. Program Description:

The program of Licensure and Regulation consists of the following areas:

- In FY 1998 the Board established the policies, procedures and rules necessary to initiate and implement Mississippi Annotated Code Sections 73-63-1 through 73-63-57 (Supp. 1997). Since that time the program has focused on improving and streamlining the application and approval process for registration and enrollment. A thorough and uniform review of qualifications for each applicant is the focus of the program. It is the program's primary function to ensure that each applicant meets or exceeds the requirements as set forth under the Registered Professional Geologists Practice Act of 1997. Hiring and retaining a qualified Executive Director is crucial to the primary function of the Board. Thus, the Board's request to increase the salary by \$2,655 is important to maintaining the efficient and primary functional operations of the agency.
- The program has established and continues to promote and expand the use of two geologic competency exams (the FG Fundamentals of Geology and the PG Practice of Geology). The FG was adopted as an "exit/assessment" examination by the three state universities that offer degrees in geology. The Board approves the candidates for the exam and administers the exams twice a year. These exams are developed by the National Association of State Boards of Geology (ASBOG) and are used by all 32 states requiring geological licensure. As part of this program objective, the Board's Director actively participates in the functions of ASBOG, by serving as a voting delegate at the national meetings, and by serving as a Subject Matter Expert during the review, update, and maintenance of the examinations.
- One significant component of the Registered Professional Geologists Practice Act of 1997 is the regulatory component of the legislation. The program's regulatory function relies on its registrants and enrollees to report suspected violations of the Registered Professional Geologists Practice Act of 1997. This includes those who attempt to publicly practice geology in the state that may not be registered or qualified to do so. This regulatory function of the Board helps to ensure the public's life, health, safety and welfare are protected.
- The Board issues temporary work permits for those registered/licensed as professional geologists in other states. This allows them to work in Mississippi without any hindrances during the application process to become registered in Mississippi.
- The Board has reciprocity/comity agreements with the Boards of Alabama, Georgia, Arkansas, Louisiana, and Texas. The reciprocity/comity agreements simplify and expedite the licensing process.
- Information dissemination is an important function of the Board. It provides for the dissemination of relevant information to existing and potential applicants, examinees, registrants, enrollees, state and federal agencies, and to the public to assure their understanding of current procedures, laws, rules and regulations governing the public practice of geology. Services provided online do provide a significant savings of time and resources, not only to the state, but to those needing forms and/or information. Online license renewals have now reached the 69% mark. Properly working and reliable computer systems are crucial to the efficient and continued success of carrying out the licensure and regulatory program of the Board. The \$5 change in Inter-Agency Fees reflects the difference in expected charges in fees from IT and other professional services to continue to perform these essential duties.
- The Board provides access/notification of educational programs, professional meetings, and offerings of continuing education seminars, short courses, training, etc. to help assure the continued professional competency and enhancement of its registrants and enrollees. Nearly all of the change in Contractual Services reflects one-time efforts of the Board made during FY 22 to provide more relevant opportunities for registrants and enrollees to find continuing education opportunities.

II. Program Objective:

The overall objectives of the Licensure and Regulation Program are to safeguard the public's life, health, safety, and welfare by thoroughly reviewing qualification of applicants; to administer qualifying/competency examinations; to investigate complaints and, where warranted, administer disciplinary actions; to provide education outreach; and to enforce the related Registered Professional Geologists Practice Act of 1997, via the Act itself along with its rules and regulations governing and related to the public practice of geology.

The program objectives include:

- To maintain access to the public records of the Board and for the Board's registrants and enrollees to have access to their personal records, especially when applying for licensure in other states. It is the program's goal to maintain agency transparency. Access to public information via the Board's website, requests for information, verification of license, and meetings with students and professionals are key components to providing access to public information and agency transparency.
- Maintaining uniform standards and practices for the qualification of applicants is a crucial component of providing equitable treatment of all applicants. The Board makes that objective a key point in the review of each application it receives. Thorough review of applicant's credentials prior to acceptance as a Registered Professional Geologist (RPG) or Geologist-In-Training (GIT) is required to ensure that each applicant meets or exceeds the requirements set forth under the Registered Professional Geologists Practice Act of 1997.
- The qualification of applicants for the FG (Fundamentals of Geology) and PG (Practice of Geology) exams and the administration of those exams are two key objectives of the program. The Board's Executive Director regularly gives presentations to students to educate them about the exams, the licensing process, and how those things affect them as professionals. By educating students about the exams and promoting licensure, the number of licensed professionals increases and the public's health, safety, and welfare are further protected.
- Assure compliance with the Registered Professional Geologists Practice Act of 1997 by those performing geologic tasks which may impact the public's life, health, safety, and welfare. Maintaining public awareness of licensure and its requirements is key to ensuring compliance with the Registered Professional Geologists Practice Act of 1997 and to increase awareness of and to report violations. It is part of the program's objective to investigate both formal and verbal complaints, and to process the complaint and complete any necessary disciplinary actions in a timely manner.
- Providing continuing education resources to the registrants and enrollees. Although continuing education is not a requirement of the Registered Professional Geologists Practice Act of 1997, participation is voluntary. Many of the Board's registrants are also registered in other states which do require continuing education to maintain their licenses. Providing resources for the Board's registrants and enrollees to find continuing education opportunities helps them professionally.
- III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 2022 & FY 2023Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

(D) Salary:

The Board requests the Executive Director's salary be increased to \$95,995.26 (Salary and Fringe). The increase would allow the Board to offer a starting salary of \$72,840 which is a 3% increase above the Mississippi State Personnel Board's Job Class Realignment Recommendation for FY 2020 for that position (OCCU 2564). The current pay range for the position is \$63,000 - \$81,900. The Mississippi State Personal Board originally made the recommendation to increase the Executive Director's salary to \$70,892.44 for FY 2018. The 3% increase reflects what the Board believes is a relevant and important cost of living increase and appropriate compensation for the Executive Director. The FY 2022 Budget Request for salary is increased by \$2,655.

(E) Capital Outlay - Equipment:

The Board plans on replacing an older computer in FY 2022 and does not anticipate needing any further equipment. Thus, the Capital Outlay request has been reduced by \$2000.

(F) Contractual Services:

The \$752 decrease in the requested Contractual Services budget reflects changes made during FY 2022 to how the Board provides information to its registrants and enrollees. The Board does anticipate a small change and increase in the fees paid to MMRS to use MAGIC and SPHARS.

(G) Commodities:

The \$735 decrease in the requested Commodities budget reflects the difference that was appropriated in FY 2022 over
